Training Media Selection

- Classroom training
 - In-person, instructor-led training which may include group exercises and interactive instructional sessions
- Computer-based training (CBT)
 - Training involving instructional aids, such as computers and tablets
 - May encompass use of data storage medium
 - such as CD-ROM or flash drive
 - Web-based training
 - · commonly referred to as eLearning
 - Distance learning and digital learning
 - such as virtual learning and gamification



Training Media Selection (2)

- Hands-on exercise
 - Exercise on use of equipment/aircraft systems that is conducted without a specific context
 - Equipment that is removed from operation, can be used for purposes of this training
 - or other representative training equipment considered acceptable by State





Training Media Selection (3)

- Simulated exercise
 - Exercise representing full context scenario (e.g. evacuation)
 - Where cabin crew apply operator's procedures and associated crew responsibilities for dealing with specific situation
 - Typically conducted in representative training device capable of reproducing appropriate environment/equipment characteristics
 - e.g. cabin, flight deck, accessible cargo compartment, crew rest area, etc.
 - or on actual aircraft

 - used to verify that task is done correctly
- Competencies
 - to be displayed during task execution

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Task List Standards

- a) Cabin surveillance to identify/monitor potential sources of fire. This includes, but not limited to:
 - i. debris in ovens (e.g. oil spills, papers, inserts);
 - ii. electrical malfunctions (e.g. tripped circuit breakers, overheating IFE);
 - iii. lavatories (e.g. waste bins, panels);
 - iv. investigating abnormal smells; and

3.4 AVIATION TERMINOLOGY

"Training should include, but is not limited to, the following topics:

- a) Aviation terminology common in operations;
- b) the phonetic alphabet in aviation-related communication; examples of misunderstandings which may arise from improper use and its effect on flight safety; [...]"

About the Content

- Content focuses on development of initial training
 - Recommended only
- For recurrent training, content may vary for
 - Tasks and sub-tasks covered
 - Training media used for training
 - Knowledge and competencies assessed
- Content of task list standards presents examples
 - Not all items need to be covered like a checklist.
- Some tasks or sub-tasks, and task list standards are repeated
 - For completeness of competencies
 - Do not need to be covered multiple times during training
